The Global Process Institute invites you to attend the fourth annual World Work seminar in Bratislava, Slovakia. Comenius University of Bratislava lends its support to this event.

The seminar will provide a unique opportunity for people from all over the world to come together in a powerful forum for focusing on and working with social, environmental, and political issues using group process work skills.

Group process work presents methods for facilitating groups at every level of interaction. Participants will be working on issues and learning skills applicable to individuals, relationships, sub-groups and the large group.

The eight days will consist of training and experience in large group settings where a variety of issues relevant to the group and the world scene will be processed. Due to the enormous social injustice in our world today, participants should expect the expression of strong emotion that often emerges in such groups. Varied styles of communication will be encouraged in order to support the expression of diverse cultural and ethnic groups.

Small groups will meet daily to practice specific training exercises in abuse work, racism, conflict resolution and facilitation. Group process work recognizes that relationship work and inner work are important aspects of any kind of group work; therefore, participants who wish to may attend private sessions to focus on individual issues that may arise. Sessions are included in the tuition. Special interest groups will have an opportunity for coalition building and networking.

The main language of the course will be English; we recognize this is a great privilege for many participants and could be a challenging factor for others. Language itself is a worldwork issue, and we hope to create an atmosphere where all languages and translations are welcome.

The organization works hard to create a diverse group in terms of nationality, race, gender, class, physical ability, sexual orientation and religion. We appreciate your help in networking with various groups which you feel need more representation.

Sitting in the Fire: Advanced Training in Worldwork

October 11-15, 1994 Bratislava, Slovakia
with Amy and Arny Mindell

This seminar will focus on worldwork supervision and certification. We will be focussing on the worldwork facilitator's eldership, the conflict and harmony between perennial spiritual traditions, social activism and world change. There will be small and large group training dealing with inner experience, revenge, revolution and the experience of the Tao.

Limited to those who have attended at least one worldwork seminar. Some experience of Process Work is recommended.

Times: Evening of October 11th, through noon on the 15th.

Registration is on October 11th between 2-6 pm.

Cost: \$295 if full payment is received by August 1st. After August 1st, \$325.

Location and Accommodations

Both worldwork seminars will take place in the town of Stupava, 17 kilometers outside of Bratislava. The name Stupava comes from the Slavic word for oil press; parts of the oil press still appear on the town coat of arms. Stupava has been inhabited by Celts, Romans, Slavs, Hungarians, and Turks, and has a long, rich and culturally diverse history. Stupava has various sites of interest to tourists; in nearby Bratislava are unique cultural events, including the renowned opera. Vienna is a pleasant day trip.

Participants will have the choice of various housing options which will be arranged on a first-come-first-serve basis. The beautiful wooded natural environment has trails for jogging, hiking and biking. Additionally, there are various sporting possibilities including horseback riding and tennis courts.

Housing Options

1. Stupava Hotel, Prices per room: double room \$30 per night, three beds \$36 per night, four beds \$40 per night. Private bathrooms.
2. Park Hotel, same as the Stupava hotel.
3. Chalet/Hostel of Scientific Technical Society, simple accommodations, rooms with three beds cost \$7 per person each night. A limited number of rooms with private bathrooms.
4. The Chalet Stein, simple accommodations, shared bathrooms. Rooms with four beds cost \$2-3 per person each night. Three kilometers from the seminar hall, bus transportation will be provided.
5. The Chalet Pod Vrchom, simple accommodations, shared bathrooms. Rooms with four beds cost \$2-3 per person each night. Five kilometers from the seminar hall, bus transportation will be provided.

Meals

Breakfast will be provided at all the hotels and chalets for the cost of \$3 per breakfast. A buffet style dinner will be provided for all participants at the Hotel Stupava for \$7 per dinner. Meals will be varied and include vegetarian selections. Participants are left to their own for lunch; there are local restaurants and shops.

• Due to the organizational challenges of this seminar we will be asking for full payment for accommodations and meals in advance.

Worldwork Scholarship and Work/Study Policy

The organization recognizes that the giving and allocating of money for scholarships and work/study positions is a worldwork project that is continually evolving as we all learn and grow in relationship to economics, education and social injustice. Therefore, this is a fluid policy which develops with our organization and worldwork. The policy for this seminar has emerged from previous participant feedback. Thanks to everyone who helped to create it!

Scholarships

The Worldwork seminar offers as many scholarships as it can and appreciates the many people who contribute funds to help with the huge expense of travel and lodging. If you feel you can afford to add a little extra money to your tuition you will be helping to make the group more diverse. Please write a separate check made out to "Scholarship Fund" and send it to the same address.

Individuals who come from countries where the local equivalency is not comparable to the United States, Western Europe, Japan or Australia are encouraged to apply for scholarships. In addition, individuals coming from the U.S., Western Europe, Australia etc., who are part of groups that have been economically disenfranchised are encouraged to apply for scholarships. Some examples of such groups are; Native Americans, Aborigines, African Americans, Latinos, Gypsies, individuals with physical disabilities, etc. Please send a brief explanation stating your need and a justification for your request. If additional help is needed with room, board and travel, please include this in your request. Scholarships will be awarded immediately as long as funds remain.

Work-Study Positions

A limited number of work-study positions will be available for individuals who need financial assistance and who come from countries where there is a fair equivalence to the U.S. dollar. For a tuition reduction we ask that work-study participants be willing to help the seminar in a variety of tasks including video-taping, cleaning and arranging the room, registration, office jobs, etc. We will ask participants to help out before, during or after the seminar and tuition reductions will coincide with the work load. Please send a brief description stating your need, a justification for your request, and also include any special skills if you have them (like video work, sound, lighting, secretarial, etc.) These positions will be chosen by lot by June 1, 1994.

Childcare

Childcare will be available for participants wanting to bring their children. University students from Slovakia who speak English will be happy to care for your children. Costs will be equivalent to the local price for childcare. The seminar will also contribute a percentage of the costs.

Cancellation Policy

The tuition is non-refundable. However, we will return a percentage of the tuition if your place can be filled.
