The Global Process Institute invites you to attend our annual worldwork seminar in Seaside, Oregon, USA. The seminar will provide a unique opportunity for people from all over the world to come together in a powerful forum for focusing on and working with social, environmental, and political issues using group process work skills.

Group process work presents methods for facilitating groups at every level of interaction. Participants will be working on issues and learning skills applicable to individuals, relationships, sub-groups and the large group.

These eight days will consist of training and experience in large group settings where a variety of issues relevant to the group and the world scene will be processed. Due to the enormous social injustice in our world today, participants should expect the expression of strong emotions that often emerge in such groups. Varied styles of communication are encouraged supporting the expression of diverse cultural and ethnic groups.

Small groups will meet often to practice specific training exercises and process group issues in a more intimate environment. Group process work recognizes that relationship work and inner work are important aspects of any kind of group work, therefore, participants may attend private sessions to focus on individual issues that may arise. Sessions are included in the price of tuition. Special interest groups will have an opportunity for coalition building and networking.

The main language of the course will be English; we recognize this is a great privilege for many participants and could be a challenging factor for others. Language itself is a worldwork issue, and we hope to create an atmosphere where all languages and translations are welcome.

The seminar will be facilitated by a group of certified process workers. Additionally, we recognize that leadership is something that emerges organically out of group process, and that everyone is a potential facilitator. Army and Amy Mindell will join the group on the 16th of January and will then be present with us for the rest of the seminar.

The organization works hard to create a diverse group in terms of nationality, race, gender, class, physical ability, sexual orientation and religion. We appreciate your help in networking with various groups which you feel need more representation.

Spirituality and Video Study
in Group Work

January 21-23, 1996

Facilitated by Army and Amy Mindell and John Johnson

We shall be investigating African Centered, Asian Centered, Native American Centered and European Centered cultural and spiritual ideas about getting along in groups. There will be work on polylogical thinking, metaskills, eldership and global viewpoints. There will also be exercises on inner work and spirituality including small group feedback. We will study video tapes from the previous worldwork seminar of large group processes around special situations such as chaos and ethnic conflicts. We will also focus on skills such as working at the double edge. *The preceding Worldwork seminar must be attended in order to enroll in this course.

TIMES: Begins on January 21st at 10 am and ends on January 23rd at noon.
TUITION: \$190 if full payment is received by November 1, 1995. After November 1st tuition is \$220.

LOCATION AND ACCOMMODATIONS

Both of these seminars will take place at the Shilo Inn in Seaside, Oregon in the United States. Seaside is a lovely resort town right on the Oregon coast and is approximately an hour and fifteen minute drive from Portland. It is on the northern coast of Oregon and has long expansive beaches.

The staff at the Shilo Inn is looking forward to hosting an international group and has made it possible for us to have this event at their wonderful facilities by offering us very generous rates. There is a restaurant, gift shop and roomy lobby, where each morning you can find complimentary coffee and newspapers. Additionally, there are heated swimming pools, saunas, steam rooms, hot tubs and weight rooms. Please note that it is fairly inexpensive to fly from Portland to Astoria, on Horizon Air. The hotel staff will be happy to meet your flight free of charge. *Participants lodging outside of the Shilo Inn will be asked to pay \$50 for use of the facilities.

ROOM OPTIONS

The Shilo Inn has two locations in Seaside. The seminar will be held at the main oceanfront location, although we will be housed in both locations. Shilo Inn east is about 6 blocks away and is in the middle of the town. It is a short walk to the main building and the hotel will provide vans which will travel between the two locations regularly. The eastside offers less expensive rates due to its location although the rooms are just as comfortable. Each room comes equipped with a phone and hair dryer and there are washers and dryers available on almost every floor. There are special rooms available designed for people with wheelchairs, and the hotel is wheelchair accessible.

The following room rates are per night for the room and include 7% tax. The hotel has generously waived all extra person charges and rollaway bed charges. Therefore, those of us on smaller budgets can sleep up to five people in a room, making it possible to pay between \$10-\$15 a night. Please note the different kinds of beds and arrangements when making your choices. For example a room with 2 queen beds can sleep five people when two people occupy each queen bed and another sleeps in a rollaway. Or in this same kind of room if you would like more privacy, three people could share it, one person taking the rollaway and the other two having their own queen beds.

ROOM REGISTRATION

Please reserve your room directly with the Shilo Inn. Rooms are reserved on a first come first serve basis, so we encourage you to make your reservations as soon as you can in order to get the room of your choice. *The hotel cannot guarantee the availability of rooms after December 8, 1995. So please reserve your room before that date.

You can reserve a room by calling the toll free number within the U.S. for all Shilo Inns at 1-800-334-1051, or you can call Seaside Shilo Inn directly at (503) 738-9571. Tell them you have a special group rate with the Global Process Institute. You will be asked to reserve the room with your credit card or to send a check or money order in U.S. dollars for one night's stay. They have a 48 hour cancellation policy; cancellation after that time forfeits your deposit.

If you do not have a roommate and would like to be connected with different people, please call our office at (503) 233-7039 and we will be happy to help you. We will then connect you with other people looking for roommates and you can then make your own reservations.

MEALS

Group breakfast and dinner will be provided at the hotel. Meals will be varied and include vegetarian selections. Breakfasts will cost \$4.50 each and dinners \$8.00. Participants are left to their own for lunch; there are local restaurants and shops.

WORLDWORK SCHOLARSHIP AND WORK/STUDY POLICY

The organization recognizes that the giving and allocating of money for scholarships and work/study positions is a worldwork project that is continually evolving as we all learn and grow in relationship to economics, education and social injustice. Therefore, this is a fluid policy which develops with our organization and worldwork. The policy for this seminar has emerged from previous participant feedback. Thanks to everyone who helped to create it!

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Worldwork seminar offers as many scholarships as it can and appreciates the many people who contribute funds to help with the huge expense of travel and lodging. If you feel you can afford to add a little extra money to your tuition you will be helping to make the group more diverse. Please write a separate check made out to "SCHOLARSHIP FUND" and send it to the same address.

Individuals who come from countries where the local equivalency is not comparable to the United States, Western Europe, Japan or Australia are encouraged to apply for scholarships. In addition, individuals coming from the U.S., Western Europe, Australia etc., who are part of groups that have been economically disenfranchised are encouraged to apply for scholarships. Some examples of such groups are Native Americans, Aborigines, African Americans, Latinos, Gypsies, individuals with physical disabilities etc. Please send a brief explanation stating your need and a justification for your request. We have limited funds available for room, board and travel. If you need this additional stipend please include this in your request. Scholarships will be awarded immediately as long as funds remain.

WORK-STUDY POSITIONS

A limited number of work/study positions will be available for individuals who need financial assistance and who come from countries where there is a fair equivalence to the U.S. dollar. For a tuition reduction we ask that work/study participants be willing to help the seminar in a variety of tasks including video-taping, cleaning and arranging the room, registration, office jobs, etc. We will ask participants to help out before, during or after the seminar and tuition reductions will coincide with the work load. Please send a brief description stating your need, a justification for your request, and also include any special skills (like video work, sound, computer, secretarial, etc.) *These positions will be chosen by need by September 1, 1995.
